

Wrap Dress LILLY

The Lilly Wrap Dress can be sewn with the opening at the front or the back of the dress. This is an easy-to-sew project and is ideal for beginners. Since the skirt of this dress is a straight, A-Line cut, it can be embellished, divided, lengthened, shortened or made wider. The skirt can be made from 3 pieces (1 front and 2 back pieces) or one complete piece.

The pattern also includes a wonderful flower-shaped pocket, which can be embellished and can also be used as an embellishment on other garments.

Make sure to take measurements before you begin and include the front length and width!

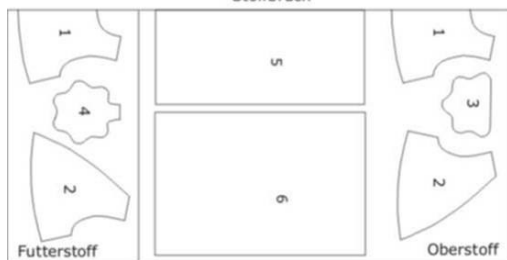

Cutting

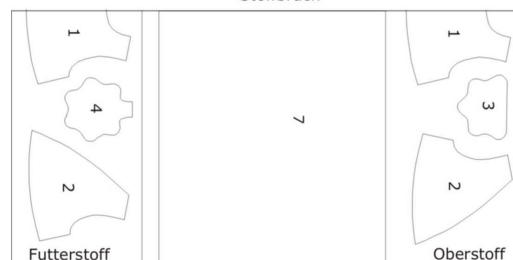
Cut the pattern pieces according to the Pattern Pieces list and add a 3/4" seam allowance. The inner bodice und pocket backing should be made with a lining fabric.

Layout

Futterstoff = Lining ~ ~ Oberstoff = Outer Garment ~ ~ Stoffbruch = Fold

Pattern Pieces

- 1 – Bodice, Front 2 x on Fold (or 1 x outer garment piece, 1 x lining)
- 2 – Bodice, Back 4 x (or 2 x outer garment pieces, 2 x linings)
- 3 – Pocket, Front 2 x
- 4 – Pocket, Backing 2 x
- 5 – Skirt, Front 1 x on Fold
- 6 – Skirt, Back 2 x
- 7 – Skirt (instead of 5 & 6) Cut on Fold, makes one finished rectangle for:
 - Size 1 / 2: 14.2" x 46.9"
 - Size 3 / 4: 16.5" x 48.6"
 - Size 5 / 6: 18.9" x 50.4"
 - Size 7 / 8: 21.7" x 52.8"
 - Size 9 / 10: 24.4" x 55.1"

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Sewing Instructions

1. Line the pocket pieces (3 & 4) and the bottom edge of the area where the buttons and button holes will be positioned with fusible web.
2. Lay the pocket pieces with the right sides together and stitch along the edge leaving a small opening to turn right side out. Trim the seam allowance. Turn right side out, iron and edge stitch around the edges. Position the pieces, one on top of the other, and stitch together a rounded stitch onto the pocket (we suggest you draw the stitch line before stitching). The flower pocket can be sewn to the seam between the bodice and the skirt or you can adapt it to button onto the garment. 3. Stitch the shoulder seams of the outer bodice piece together and the bodice lining together. Lay the pieces with the right sides together and stitch the area around the armholes and the neckline together. Trim the seam allowance. Turn the garment with the right side out.
4. Stitch the side seams together in one continuous stitch. Trim the seam allowance. Iron the edges and then finish the seam off with an edge stitch.
5. For Variation 1, stitch the Skirt front and back pieces together (5 & 6). Serge the seams, sides and hem. For Variation 2, serge the hem and side seams.
6. Gather the top edge of the skirt. To do so, make 2 parallel wide stitches with decreased thread tension and leave some thread hanging at the beginning and end of the stitch to pull and create gathering. Pin the skirt and bodice with the right sides together, making sure to align the side seams of the bodice and skirt accordingly.
7. Begin pulling the gathering threads on both sides until you have reached the desired size. Secure the threads to a pin and stitch together between the 2 parallel lines (make sure to increase the thread tension again). Remove the bottom gathering thread; fold the seam allowance in and serge.
8. Use the button hole stencil of the pattern and mark the points for the buttons and button holes on the back of the bodice, create button holes, stitch the buttons on and you're done!
